Alec's Mardle

(Alec Reynolds was born in Trimingham in 1926 and has lived here all his life)

I left school at 13, as my 14th birthday came in the holidays. started work at Hall Farm, it was Harvest time. This is a nice time on a farm. I went to Beacon Farm as I was loaned out. I worked among the poultry; there were hundreds from day olds to laying hens. My Uncle was Foreman. I stayed there for 2 years, and then I went back to Hall Farm. After a time Church Farm could not get a cowman so I went there to help out, then I went back to Hall Farm. After that I went to Bizewell Farm for 2 years, and then I went and worked for the War Agricultural Department. I was picked up by lorry and we went around different farms, there were about 20 of us. Some did not know much about farm work, I was put in charge of a gang of 5. We got on very well as they had worked on farms. We did sugar beeting, potato picking, and draining, building bridges over the dykes. I was there for 6 months. I left and got a job on a farm at Ivy Farm, Sidestrand and was there for 17 years. I done milking, looking after the cattle, all tractor work, stacking straw and corn stacks and thatching. The combine then came in which I drove and stacking ceased. I drove various makes of tractors, the one I drove the longest were Fergusson. When I left Ivy Farm I went and worked for Norfolk County Council and stayed for 28 years. I started at the Holt Depot, then North Walsham, Stalham and finished at Caister. I worked in most of the villages and shopping centre in Norfolk. I had a lorry and I picked men up and we did roadwork. I was in charge of a gang which could be from 2 men to 10.

Sorry for the many cancelled events of the past week, but the surfaces have not been conducive to safe walking and driving.

Nature Notes for March

As I write the weather is changing to an east wind coming from Siberia. The sea was all white topped waves and very choppy, but on the path behind the Pilgrim Shelter was a Songthrush, possibly the same one which was on my front lawn a few days earlier. While watching the thrush I could hear a chaffinch already rehearsing its mating song of a descending scale, a bit too early to be effective but you never know your luck.

I also heard my first skylark of the year at Cley and they are usually to be heard most days around the lanes, in fact I can often hear them from my garden.

Another recent sighting, thanks to Tony Smith, was a Marsh Harrier which was perched on his back-garden fence obviously waiting to pounce on any small bird visiting the feeders.

Snowdrops and crocuses are now showing everywhere and daffodils and tulips are pushing through and on various shrubs and trees buds can be seen. On one of my walks during the week I saw catkins on a couple of alder trees which is normal for this time of year. Willow catkins also come around this time.

A bit further afield there were about 60 gadwall ducks on the lake at Felbrigg along with shovellers, tufted ducks, mallard, teal, widgeon and swans. Also, about a dozen cormorants, some of which were roosting in the trees on the far side of the lake.


