Alec's Mardle

(Alec Reynolds was born in Trimingham in 1926 and has lived here all his life)

Buxton Hall was the school; it was left to the village by Rev Buxton who owned most of the village. The school was left to be used as a Village Hall and it was used for a number of years. It was used for Whist Drives, Dances, Concerts, Parties - Christmas, Weddings and Birthdays. Trimingham Sea Scouts also used it and I was one. At the front which joins the road was a big flag pole, it had been a ship's mast and had 4 guy ropes to support it. It took up all the front area. We used to fly the flags and the international code flags. The school was sold as Trimingham could not afford to run 2 halls, so they kept Pilgrim Shelter. The school was turned into living accommodation which got the name Buxton Hall.

Community Housing.

You will have seen from the notes from the Parish Council meeting that it has been decided to move forward with our project to bring affordable homes to Trimingham. We are aiming to have a meeting in May, inviting those from our community who have expressed an interest in finding out more about community led affordable housing. At this meeting the group will be able to talk more about how the community wants to be involved in a housing scheme and explore forming a steering group to move us onto the next stage of this exciting new project for our village

Parish council meeting Monday 12th March

We discussed the scheme community led housing and the decision was made to move forward. Two sites have been suggested. More information to follow.

During the meeting we welcomed Councillor Hillary Cox who gave an interesting presentation concerning the Cromer Shoal Chalk Beds. It was agreed that we would work with NNDC to develop this special feature. Check NNDC website for further information.

Vale Road access to the beach remains closed but will be opened for Easter. It was agreed that whilst the access road is closed Councillor Fitch Tillet would look into improving access for pedestrians.

PC Peter Davidson attended our meeting to discuss setting up a community speed watch group. Seven members of the public who attended the PC meeting volunteered to be involved with this scheme and a separate familiarisation meeting would be arranged. Speeding in Gimingham road has been reported to Highways County Council. They suggest that a SAM mobile speeding sign could be utilized. We will apply to the Partnership Funding Scheme in December. Through this scheme 50% of the cost can be awarded.

The Pilgrim Shelter future use continues to be discussed and will remain on our agenda. Options such as the Deep History Coast and Cromer Shoal Chalk beds offer opportunities.

Nature Notes for April

Spring seems to be here at last. At the time of writing I have 9 croaking frogs in my small pond and blue tits are examining the nearby nest box which had been blown off during the recent gales. I only replaced it a week ago.

This morning there was a flock of fieldfares feeding along the hedge bordering my back garden and a pair of partridges on my front lawn. (I believe they are only called a brace when they are dead). The fieldfares are now preparing for their next journey back to northern Europe to breed along with the geese and swans which will also be leaving soon. The local skylarks are in full song as you will hear if you walk the lanes (without headphones of course).

On the other hand, we can shortly expect to hear the call of chiffchaffs which are usually among the first arrivals from Africa with sand martins arriving at about the same time.

I wrote before about the decline in wildlife numbers in the countryside. Well the French have just produced a report showing a steep decline in their wildlife, including birds and insects of 33% in the past 15 years. The reasons given being intensive industrial farming methods including the possible over usage of neonicotinoids to eliminate 'pests'. A major problem being that they also do the same to the good guys such as bees and butterflies.

As I write this I can hear a robin calling in the garden, so it is not all bad and there are goldfinches on the feeders


