Alec's Mardle continued from May

I was lent out to Beacon Farm. They kept hundreds of poultry and my job was looking after them. We had day old chicks which were kept under cover with an oil lamp to keep them warm. Then we had the different ages up to the laying hens. In the winter time the laying hens used to have warm water to drink first thing. They had meal to eat which had cod liver oil mixed in. After all the poultry had been fed they had to be cleaned out. Fresh sawdust for the little chicks and straw for the laying hens. I had to collect the eggs three times a day. It was a busy life. The poultry houses were on the field on the opposite side of the road to the farmhouse and in Middle Street where the bungalows and sandpit are now. I worked there for two years.

Nature Notes for April

Late spring flowers are showing in the hedgerows with the blues of bluebell, speedwell, alkanet and forget-me-not, purple cranesbill and yellow marsh marigold together with the pinks and reds of campion, herb Robert and ragged robin; hawthorn is also in full bloom, probably about 3 weeks later than usual and covered in huge creamy white heads of 30 or so flowers. I haven't seen many pink hawthorns in Norfolk.

I haven't seen many bees this year wherever I have been, including on wildlife reserves and in my own garden. Has anybody else noticed this?

Migrant birds are back. Swifts are nesting in the roofs opposite Mundesley butchers and can be heard screaming around the rooftops. I have seen house martins and sand martins but only a few swallows. Red kites and buzzards are around and as the barley in the field behind my house is growing I can hear, but not see, partridge and larks and a couple of days ago I had a visit from a hen pheasant with 7 chicks.

I watched 2 hobbies hunting dragonflies and was lucky enough to snap one in midflight eating its catch.

From a hide at Cley I counted 29 avocet nests and photographed one when the sitting birds changed shifts. When I checked the picture there were 4 eggs, difficult to see because they were disguised as pebbles. 2 successes.
