#### Trimingham Housing Need survey

Included with this newsletter is a copy of the housing needs survey. You are aware that this subject has been discussed at some length, and that a steering group comprising Trimingham residents has been setup to establish whether the project has a future. Now is our chance to express our views and for us to establish whether there is a need for this community led housing project to move forward. Please be aware of the preferred closing date of the 21st September to return the forms.

#### **Pilgrim Shelter**

Most of the community events that were held in the shelter have now moved to the new hall, and that has been very successful. But the success of the new building has been achieved at the expense of the shelter, which is already starting to look somewhat forlorn! It has been confirmed that the outside area around the building will become a 'discovery point' which is part of the Deep History Coast Project being promoted by NNDC (more details to follow later this year), but that does not secure the fabric of the building. We are somewhat concerned that a winter without use with have a marked effect on the shelter, both inside and out. We are looking via the parish council at alternate uses, and there have been many suggestions about how it could be used in the future, but all of these ideas rely on two things. The first is making a decision we all agree with and the second is having people who will step up to help. Whatever is agreed will have to be driven by volunteers! There are some strong feelings in the village about this iconic little building and it now needs our help to allow it to move into its next role within our community. I reported that I had seen an albino guillemot on the groynes behind the Pilgrim Shelter, but it is no longer there in the large flock of up to 50 birds. I do have photos to prove this. I also reported that Tony Smith had found dead young kestrels at the bottom end of Middle Street within 3 days. They showed no sign of road or other injury so it is a mystery how they died. I also found a dead kestrel on the track to Blackberry Cottage last year at about the same time, only about 500 yards away. As none of the bodies were recovered we can't be sure of what killed them.

This month has seen the disappearance of swifts and most of the swallows and the rest of the migrants will be on their way in the next few weeks. They will be followed by the inward migrants from the North from the middle of September onwards.

There have been lots of butterflies around and I came across a silver washed fritillary (yes that's really its name) in Sheringham Park. These are not a usual find in Norfolk but have been found in recent years. Global warming anybody?

I also saw a peregrine falcon sitting on the wires not far from Coastguard Cottages on the 9th of August.

Following the recent rain my lawns are green again and the sugar beet is looking much healthier and the blackberries are at last starting to fill.

(Alec Reynolds was born in Trimingham in 1926 and has lived here all his life)

#### continued:

I went to Norfolk County Council Highways. I started off working with different gangs doing new roads and widening some. In between I was roadman for the villages near home. Then I got a lorry. We had a hut on the back which the men travelled in. There were five in the gang which I was in charge of, and also the work that needed doing. We went around the villages every thirteen weeks doing pot holes, edging the road sides, footpaths, draining. Sometimes we would get an emergency call, that was most weekends or night time. Winter time it would be gritting and snow ploughing. When I first started we would have to go to Holt to get the salt, it was anytime from midnight onwards. My depot was at Holt where we would get the tarmac etc., also tools. I ended up at Stalham Depot.
