Trimingham community led housing project

Dear Trimingham residents

As you will be aware the Trimingham Community-Led Housing Steering Group have been carrying out a Housing Needs Survey for the village. The Steering Group would like to thank those who returned their form.

We now have the results which were discussed at our meeting on Monday 29 October. Whilst the return rate was a little on the low side there has been some housing need identified. The Steering Group was keen to explore what the 'Next Steps' could be.

You may be aware of some very recent news in that Norfolk County Council are planning to sell a piece of land on the Gimingham Road, just inside the borderline of Trimingham. In light of this the Steering Group have asked if a meeting of interested parties could be brought together to discuss what opportunities this plot could bring to the village. The Community-Led Housing at North Norfolk District Council team have offered to facilitate this meeting, arranging to bring these key groups together. This is just the first stage in what could be a very exciting new venture for the residents of Trimingham.

Nature Notes for November

We seem to have a pair of resident buzzards as I have seen them most days for a couple of weeks. The other day though I was walking up the lane to Woodland when saw a large bird fly into the trees behind the new Village Hall. I waited and watched for several minutes and it came out and flew across to the track between Woodland and Hall Lane where it sat on a bush for another few minutes. It was a Honey Buzzard and there are only 43 breeding pairs in UK. We are on their migration route to Africa, so we hope it survives the guns of some of the Mediterranean countries such as Malta and Cyprus.

Other sightings were about 40 linnets on the wires behind my bungalow, a rare sight these days, a flock of around 600 Brent geese at Cley and Blackcaps behind the Pilgrim Shelter.

I wondered why I had a runny nose until I found a field of rape in full bloom on the cliff top in October! It is the only pollen that affects me.

It will soon be pupping time for the grey seals and they will be arriving in numbers at Blakeney and Horsey throughout November and December and all within a few hundred yards of the car park at Horsey. An amazing experience.

I was reading in the Newsletter that Trimmingham is having a Trosh Day. I have done several weeks of that in the past which we called Threshing. The Threshing Machine was a steam engine, a drum, straw pitcher and a chaff cutter. It was a great sight to see the machines going through the village to the farms. The men would hang their bicycles on the back of the straw pitcher. When the machine was sat next to the corn stack they could then cycle to and from the site, some had to cycle long distances and there was a man who lived in Middle Street who walked following the machine from farm to farm. They used to have to have the steam up ready for 7.30am when the men started work. The farmer, if he threshed on a Monday, the start of the week, had to pay the insurance for the week. They were not too happy to thresh on a Monday. It was alright if you got a whole weeks threshing to do. It was only the big farmers who did that.
