Trimingham Community Housing Steering Group

The Steering Group had a very productive meeting on 10 June.

- A planning officer came from NNDC and took the Group through the key issues that we need to consider for the project. We had a good opportunity to ask a range of questions important for the Trimingham Community Housing project and considered additional issues around coastal erosion, roll back and that our village is in an Area of Natural Beauty.

- Further discussion took place about the upcoming meetings with interested Housing Associations. It is planned that we will meeting three organisations in July.

- We worked through a range of questions that we will be asking and how we are going to assess representative's responses.

- We agreed to carry out some research into each organisation and Exception Sites they have developed prior to meeting with representatives

- We are also considering options around employing an independent consultant to help build our skills in working together as team.

- What a terrible day when the houses burned on the Cromer Road and Staden Park. We must be grateful that no-one was hurt and thank the Fire Service for all their hard work in very difficult circumstances. The village have been splendid in rallying round and helping Helen and all her family in many ways. They wish us to pass on their thanks

I have just read about another cliff fall. I know we have had a lot of rain but what about all the springs in the ground which used to supply the drinking water from the pumps or wells for all the houses etc., before the water main was installed. The water is still in the ground somewhere. If all the springs were tapped think of the amount of water that could be saved. Years ago, there was a Water Diviner who came to the village. He found seven springs in the field behind the cottages in Church Street. The man's name was Mr Bloom from Southrepps. Then there is all the water, which is put onto the land, which is a great volume of water, to help the crops grow. The years I worked on the farm there was no irrigation. The crops fed on the muck that was put on the land and ploughed in and fed the land. How times have changed.

Nature Notes for July

The 3 peregrine falcon chicks on Cromer church tower are developing nicely with their primary feathers starting to show. They have been ringed so that they can be traced should anything befall them.

The swans at Fellbrigg are down to 4 cygnets as last year, probably due to predation but who knows. There were large numbers of blue damsel flies all over the lake and the surrounding paths and fields eliciting comments from some visitors.

We have had an almost constant southerly wind recently which possibly accounts for the numbers of Painted Lady butterflies around as they often come in from Northern France. There were more than a dozen on the blue flowering shrubs outside Mundesley Library,? hebe, together with several types of bee..

Swift numbers are down by 50% this year according to a report I read and by local observations, bad weather in the Mediterranean countries a month or more ago being a likely cause. I have seen a few in Mundesley, Trunch and most recently Cromer, screaming around as is their wont. I have also seen bats over my front garden which has a very small pond.

It was reported that about a dozen Little Tern eggs were stolen from a protected site at Winterton beach and that 3 men on jet skis were harassing the seals at their breeding site in Lincolnshire, probably Donna Nook. They were caught on camera so there may be some hope of catching them.

I was recently in South Yorkshire for a few days and visited the Rother Valley Country Park, reclaimed colliery land which has been transformed by planting and landscaping. There is a lot of water-based activity, water skiing, ski jumping, Kayaking, rowing etc so I was surprised when seeing my binoculars and camera asked if I had come to see the orchids. There was an abundance of common orchids and a good number of spotted orchids plus a small patch of white ones which I haven't yet identified but the stars of the show were several bee orchids near to the entrance to the park. They look a bit like a bumble bee and give off a scent that attracts the male bee who when he arrives to mate actually pollinates the flower.

I stayed on a small caravan site in the grounds of a former stately home which was rescued from dereliction by Sheffield city council and is now used as a conference centre and wedding venue. It has a walled garden in which I found several harlequin ladybirds which are invaders and eat our native red or yellow ladybirds. Harlequins are almost black and with a single red spot on each wing and are twice as big as our red ones. I erased the ones that I found, please do the same if you see them.

On my return home I was pleased to see 7 jackdaws feeding in my back garden.
