Trimingham Community Housing Steering Group

Monthly meeting on Monday 12th August, and we were joined by Neil Salisbury, who will be the project leader representing Hastoe Housing.

We discussed the two sites that were being considered for this project (Cromer Road and Middle Street) and it was decided that we would press on with the Cromer Road option. Middle Street has, we believe difficulties such as access, narrow lanes etc that would give problems.

Neil stated that Hastoe were carrying out a legal search on the chosen site to establish its viability. This search would cover all aspects including the ability of being able to raise finance to proceed with the development. We went on to discuss the housing mix, and suggestions were put forward. This mix will be confirmed at a later date. However, it is confirmed we are looking at a development of 10 units.

Hopefully later this year a community consultation event will be arranged at the hall and all will be invited so you can see what we have achieved. Hastoe will support this event.

I can always remember my Dad saying that they had been working on the cliff top pulling swedes for cattle food, it was a horse and cart at that time. They left off for dinner and fed and watered the horses. When they had finished their dinner, they returned to the field on the cliff top and where they had been working that morning it had all fallen down onto the beach. It was about an acre of land.

Nature Notes for September

The last week of August felt like the start of autumn then there was a heatwave bringing out all kinds of butterflies again. Birds were less confused as the swifts have all gone and the swallow's nests at Sheringham Park were empty whereas they were still feeding young early last September.

It came to me whilst on a walk that I wasn't seeing any wasps around in late August. This is the time when the drones are redundant and start foraging for food before they die, while the Queens are maturing and preparing to hibernate. Last winter I mentioned that that I had found fewer queens in my woodpile than previous years. I put the logs bearing the queens on a separate pile to preserve them for the next year.

There were more than a dozen immature newts in the pond at Sheringham Park with a number of leeches and water boatmen if you looked closely. I pointed these out to a couple of families who were watching the dragonflies and the pond snails

There were 5 Whimbrels at Cley and I saw one of them. They breed further North and are probably migrating back to Africa. At Hickling I saw 6 Great Egrets one of which was having a "handbags at dawn" with a heron. There was no winner as they are the same size. Stubb Mill, on the reserve, was open that day and I had a log chat with Hazel Nudd whose late husband was the last operator of the mill which was originally a wind pump that regulated the water level on the marsh for agriculture. When the sails fell off in 1930 the Nudd family acquired a Garrett Steam engine to power the pump. That worked until 1940 when it was replaced by a diesel engine until 1975 when it was no longer needed, and the mill was closed.

The steam engine was built at The Long Shop at Leiston, Suffolk, which is now a museum and my friend Richard, on whose farm I stay, is a patron and a collector of old farm machinery. I have written before that his organic farm is alive with all kinds of wildlife. I'm hoping to go back in September when he is having a "Farming in the Past" day.
