Alec's Mardle

(Alec Reynolds was born in Trimingham in 1926 and has lived here all his life)

When I was younger and fitter I used to go shooting on Mr Harrison's estate. When I first started I went as a beater with a flag which you waved to make the birds fly high. I would line up in front of the guns, the other beaters would drive the woods shouting and rattling sticks on the trees. When you had done that plantation you would move to the next.

In later years Mr Harrison said "Why don't you drive the tractor with a trailer on and transport the beaters and the man in charge of them". I did this until I was unable to do it any more.

The man in charge would tell me where to drop the beaters. They would spread out in a line and wait until the guns got into position, the whistle would be blown and the shoot would start.

The shoot would start about 9.00am and finish about 4.00pm.

When I was at school if there was a shoot on a Saturday I would go and we would start just before it got light. We would try to stop the birds flying onto neighboring land.

The pay was 3 shillings for a boy and 10 shilling for a man

Nature notes for February 2020

As I sat on one of John's chairs on the cliff behind the Pilgrim Shelter watching the tide come in I thought about the power of the sea. Trimingham is about 2 kilometres from end to end and the tide rises and falls around 2 metres twice a day so if we measure 1 kilometre out to the sea we have 4 million cubic metres of water moving in and out twice a day, a total of 16 million cubic metres, which nobody is harnessing, on our bit of coast. This does not take into account the flow north or south as swimmers know. I hope somebody is looking into this alternative source of power or am I an optimistic fool?

On a lighter note, along many of our beaches you can see Turnstones, a small mainly black and white bird about starling size, which can also be found on the promenades of Cromer and Sheringham and the sea wall at Walcott. They are very tame and many people put down food for them. They will be here until about March when they will return to the Arctic to breed.

Snowdrops are out in some places, in increasing numbers and I have tiny blue violets in my borders. They are very prolific and I have to keep them at bay. I also have a Camellia in bloom.

I heard a greater-spotted woodpecker hammering but found it hard to find even though I looked for about 5 minutes so I went on my way. On my way back to my car about an hour later I heard it again and eventually found it.

As the days grow longer when I look at the sunset from my garden the sun is now setting just south of Southrepps Church Tower which sometimes is quite spectacular with the tower silhouetted against the red sun.
