I read recently that the Government is going to try and stop vehicles using petrol and diesel. This made me remember that during the Second World War even our local buses had to pull a small two wheeled trailer behind it which had a container of gas in it. The gas was used to run the bus.

There was a Harley Street specialist doctor, Dr Orpen who lived in Middle Street and he had to travel to London for his clinic and had his car converted to gas and the gas tank was in the boot.

His wife used to collect the money for War Bonds, a few pennies each week and when you had paid in £1 you got a Certificate and after 5 years it was worth One Pound 5 shillings.

Nature notes for April 2020 - Mac Marshall

The cold wind and rain are still with us and the birds are mainly lying low except on the occasional dry and sunny day.

An experienced countryman neighbour saw 2 magpie sized white birds fly over one morning in early March and after searching my books, we concluded that they possibly were 2 Great Grey Shrike, which winter here and one was seen down Gimingham Hill last March.

I was driving to Mundesley at 11.00am, when I saw 4 Muntjac strolling across the field behind Gaffer's repair shop. When I was clearing weed in my small pond, I pulled out a greyish ball of something which turned out to be a pair of mating frogs. They didn't seem to be unduly disturbed by my intrusion, so I replaced them and a couple of days later I had frog spawn, then several frogs and more spawn followed. My forsythia hedge is suddenly full of bright yellow blooms. It is an interesting bush in that, like blackthorn, it flowers before the leaves arrive. If you time it right you can cut long twigs a couple of weeks early and bring them indoors causing them to bloom earlier.

One afternoon behind Pilgrim Shelter I saw what I think were 4 eider ducks on the sea. They were quite far off but were too black and white to be anything else. They most definitely were not gulls.

2 people have mentioned a barn owl hunting at the top of Middle Street and I was lucky enough to see it one day when I was coming home by car, and another day I watched a buzzard being mobbed by crows in the quarry. It stood the harassment for a few minutes before flying towards the sea.

The spiky leaves of bluebell are now pushing through the dead leaves in the woods so it will soon be time for the 1000 or so Brent Geese, which were on Salthouse Marsh on my last visit to Cley, to depart north to their breeding grounds in the Arctic.
