The two-year programme of monitoring the movement on the cliff top by UEA finished at the end of August. Coastwise Project update

As you will know from the previous newsletter we are getting closer to progressing the two projects, **Middle Street Pond** and **Jubilee Wood**.

In principle the grants that we have applied for from NNDC Coastwise have been approved, but there is some concern about the consequences regarding any additional ground water that we will be diverting into the water system. Certainly, with the changes that we are hoping to make to the Jubilee Wood drainage system, there would be more water diverted into the River Mun which would increase flows downstream. Therefore we have been asked to commission a survey in an endeavour to identify these water flows to ensure we are not creating further flood issues elsewhere.

Hopefully we can get this done fairly quickly so we can press forward in the next few months. *Terry Brown.*

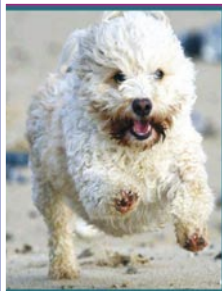

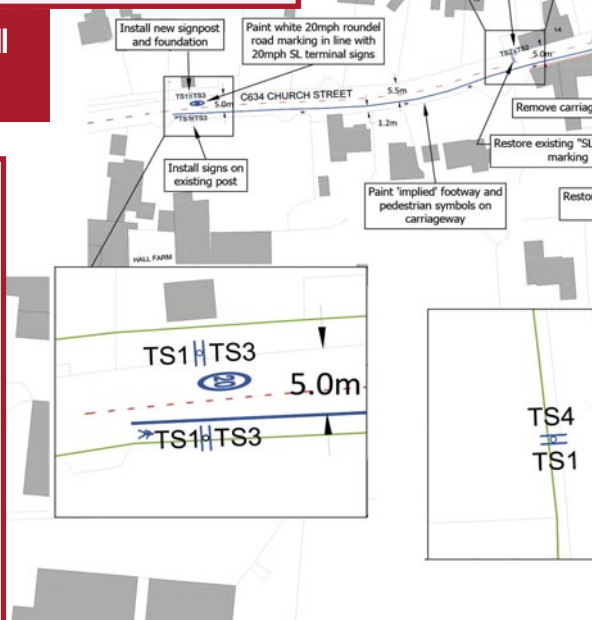
20mph Speed Limit & Pedestrian Safety

We have now completed the village survey with Norfolk County Council Highways team, and they have given us the final conclusions regarding the 20mph zone through the village. Because it is very difficult to agree a cross over position for the lined implied footway by the Church, the NCC safety team have instructed that the pedestrian way will only pass down one side of the road, from the existing footpath (by the telephone box) to the end of the 20mph zone. At that position the viewpoints both up and down the road will be clear so pedestrians can cross safely.

We are now in a consultation period and still expect this work to proceed in the Autumn.

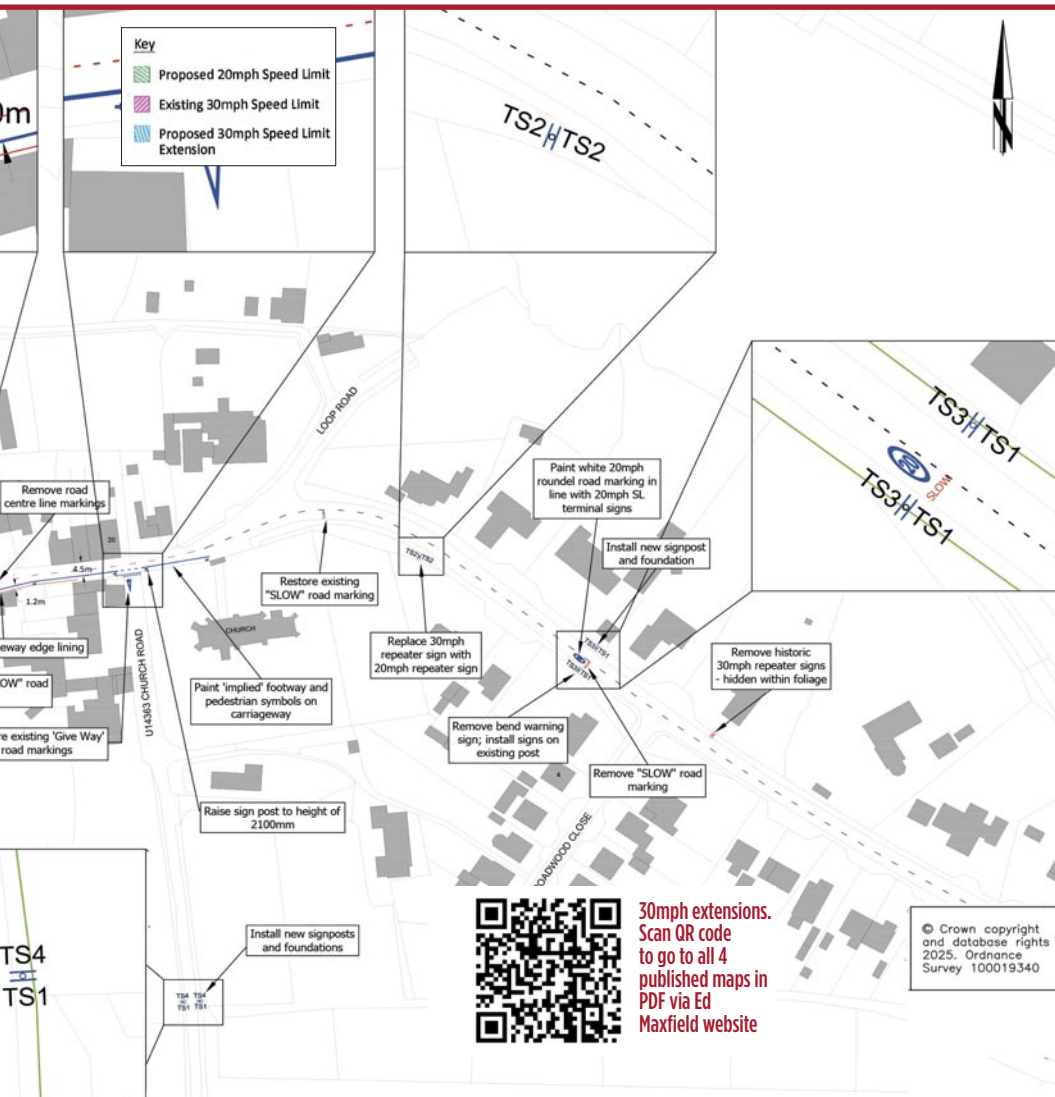

The meeting on the 9th July was well attended by members of the public from the village, matters discussed included:

The quotes were received for the work to the telephone box and bus shelter, the quote from Pete's Property was accepted.

There was much discussion regarding repairs to The Pilgrim Shelters entrance facade and the problem with the run off of rain from the car parking area into the front footings.*

The situation with youngsters sledging old pallets down the cliff and setting them alight was discussed and no further action was required at this time.

Highways are progressing with the planned works to slow the traffic past the church and to the ends of the village. The Parish council have paid £5000 towards these works.

The Coastwise plans for Jubilee Wood and the Pond at the end of Middle Street have made grant applications.

Nature Notes *from Mac Marshall*

I picked and enjoyed gooseberries from the garden for 3 days then one morning I opened my curtains and saw a muntjac beside the bush, and when I went to check the bush it was stripped bare!

Now for some good news, some butterflies have had a good year compared with 2024. There has been a late flush of large whites and gatekeepers and I recently saw a small blue on my hydrangea.

There are still some swallows and sand martins about but swifts have already returned to Europe before continuing to Africa.

You may be aware of my interest in oak wasps which lay their eggs in oak flowers and result in deformed acorns when the eggs hatch (see the picture). There are several insect species which also cause "oak apples" all of which cause different deformities. If you would like to see these spiky green growths there are some on the oak tree behind the chancel in the churchyard, easily seen from the ground. Knopper wasps aren't stingers like the common wasp so you will be quite safe.



Another large but harmless insect which you might find is the hornet hoverfly which is disguised as a hornet to deter predators. Hornets, by the way, are not as fearsome as we are led to believe and I have sat next to hornets nests to watch them quite safely.
