Village News

Pilgrim Shelter repairs

Due to a Structural engineer survey the feature above the front door is 'leaning'. The Parish Council have appointed a contractor to dismantle this feature, and reinstate so making sure it is secure.

As part of the contract, we will also deal with the rain water problem. At the moment excess rain water is discharged directly into the French drain and not helping the damp problems.

There is also consideration as to the feasibility of reinstating the "balls" that featured on the original building.

It is planned for these works to commence in November with minimal interruption to the activities at the Shelter.

When covered by sea or sand, if walking or letting your dogs swim these could cause injuries.

The position when last seen is indicated right, it's towards Sidestrand rather than Trimingham cliff trail. They may move with the tides, so stay safe.

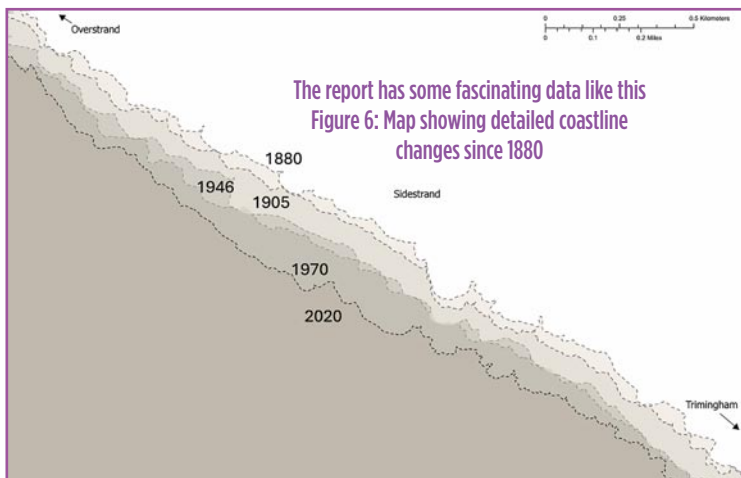
DISTANS Project Update

We have heard back from Jess Johnson at UEA and the team are excited to share the latest on the project, here's a summary of their key findings:

- 1. Detecting Tiny Cliff Cracks in Real Time:** A new method (SSTA) can detect tiny seismic events (nanoseismicity) indicating cracks in the cliff, offering unprecedented early warning potential for coastal erosion.
- 2. Fluid Flow at the Crown and Anchor Site:** Surveys show significantly higher fluid flow in the northwest corner of the field opposite the Crown and Anchor, which may affect cliff stability.
- 3. Vegetation and Slope Stability:** Non-vegetated areas are more likely to slip than vegetated ones, highlighting the importance of natural vegetation in reducing erosion.
- 4. Historical Coastal Retreat:** A digital model of the last 200 years is being constructed to investigate the impact of coastal defenses on Trimmingham's coastline.
- 5. Noise Analysis:** Ocean noise and sediment shifting are being localized using seismic nodes, aiding further investigations into recorded signals.

What next? – The analysis of the collected data will continue. The team wish to thank you for your continued support in understanding our dynamic coastline.

Highways Update

Highways Speed Limit Changes in Trimingham, Sidestrand, Overstand, Gimingham, and Mundesley

As part of the County's Speed Management Plan, I have been informed that the statutory consultation period has commenced and will run through to 11th November 2025. Norfolk County Council have installed copies of the Order Notice in Trimingham and will keep us informed as the consultation progresses. *(Scan QR code to view order, or <https://trimingham.org/wp-content/uploads/2025/11/PGA085-Speed-Limit-20-30-and-40-mph-SLO-Notice-of-Proposals.pdf>)*

Summary of order: Norfolk County Council is proposing new traffic regulations to improve road safety in the area. A new 20 mph speed limit will be introduced on sections of Church Road, Church Street, and Loop Road in Trimingham. Existing 30 mph limits will be extended or clarified on several roads, including Cromer Road, Gimingham Road, Hall Road, Middle Street, and Mundesley Road. The 40 mph limits on parts of Cromer Road and Mundesley Road will be consolidated and slightly varied for better clarity. The detailed proposals, maps, and reasons for these changes are available for viewing online at www.norfolk.citizenspace.com and at the Norfolk County Council offices during normal hours.

After this consultation period, the Parish Council will be informed and hopefully when the improvements will commence.

Nature Notes *from Mac Marshall*

Season change is here again. I was in Suffolk in September, watching bitterns at Minsmere. The scrapes were very dry so there weren't many waders about apart from four Speckled Redshank, a new species for me.

I was invited to accompany Richard on his daily inspection of his herd and noticed that there was a small flock of swallows skimming the grass and taking insects that had been disturbed by the cows. They were going south for the winter. The blind calf that was born in March is surviving and he says they might keep her as a pet. He also used to have a pet pig called Pig but she died last year.

I saw more swallows on my last day there, then when I was home I went out in the evening and as I was driving my friend said there were geese above us. It was the first skein of pink footed geese of the year. I went to Cley that weekend and a warden said there were about 5000 roosting nightly, so swallows going out, geese coming in.

Hickling was still dry, so few geese there but I did see a small flock of Bearded Tits, a kingfisher and then two Goldeneye Ducks in the far distance.

There were four buzzards circling over Southrepps Common and even while I was preparing this, one was floating along the cliff top opposite my front window, eyes down, searching for prey.

In my garden the ivy is covered in green flowers and was alive with wasps, honey bees and bumblebees, being a good source of nectar at this time in the season.
