Coastwise Update from Terry

Middle Street / Old Pub site

You will probably have noticed some little markers that have been placed in the field at the bottom of Middle Street. This indicates the general outline of the pond (see below) and we'd like to have this done as soon as possible, however there is a last minute problem which has occurred with regard to the section of hedge we wish to remove. There may be some planning permissions we need! If so, it is likely that we will miss this season and have to wait until September due to nesting birds. As we mentioned in our last newsletter, we had to have some surveys done regarding water flows and the contractor we chose carried out an extensive survey and his work came back indicating no problems. The pond will fill naturally, holding back ground water and allowing evaporation rather than soaking into the ground and going out towards the cliff. The area around the pond will be fenced with permissive access from the landowner. It is our intention to turn this pond into a community asset, encouraging wildlife and pond planting.

On the pub site you will have seen some white posts marking out the line of a fence that will be installed marking out the boundary of the historic 'Taylors Lane'. This lane runs down the side of Beacon Farm and pedestrian access will be allowed to the cliff edge. At the top there will be a sign board giving some information about the location and a bench with a sea view! The other parts of the site will be fenced off, with no access allowed. This is to allow the overgrowth to naturally populate the area and help to stabilise the cliff.

Jubilee Wood

This project was to run in parallel with Middle Street, but because we had the late requests (as indicated in the previous newsletter) thrown at us this will not now happen until Autumn 2026. Whilst the reports were positive, EGH had planned to plant Sugar beet in the field so the drainage work to the field and to the pond cannot be carried out until this is harvested. However the nominated footpaths, or permissive paths will go ahead. These have been planned, and will be sign posted around the area. When the work on Jubilee wood is completed this will be a remarkable village asset.

Have you read in the local and national press that the Environment Agency has now given NNDC and Coastwise further funding to continue their work? We now see a clear path through to 2029 so we can now start thinking.....WHAT NEXT!!

Coastguard Rescue at Trimingham Cliffs

The photograph on the front cover of this newsletter shows an emergency response that took place at Trimingham on the afternoon of Friday 21 February.

According to the HM Coastguard Press Office, a man was reported to be stuck in mud on the cliffs at Trimingham at approximately 4.15pm. Cromer and Bacton Coastguard Rescue Teams were tasked to the incident, and the man was released safe and well. He was then transported to safety by the Mundesley Volunteer Inshore Lifeboat.

This incident serves as a timely reminder to residents and visitors to take extra care when using coastal paths and cliff-top areas, particularly during wet weather.

We are grateful to the Coastguard Rescue Teams and the volunteer lifeboat crew for their swift response and professionalism in ensuring a safe outcome.

A reminder of the dangers of mud and quicksand

Mud and quicksand can be dangerous as once you're stuck, it's incredibly difficult to get out without help from trained rescuers. As well as the danger of sinking, there's also a risk of drowning due to rising water levels and tides.

If you do get trapped, sit back to spread your weight evenly across the surface.

Stop others from trying to help you, as they might get stuck too.

If you get stuck, **call 999 immediately and ask for the Coastguard.**

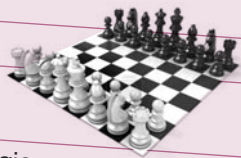

Trimingham Parish Council

Following the Parish Council election held on Thursday, 15 January, the five newly appointed councillors took up their positions at the meeting on Wednesday 21 January. We welcome Linda Brown, Alan Farrow, Sue Rust, Sandy Wood and Sarah Young. Councillor Linda Brown was voted in as Chair with Councillor Sarah Young as Vice-Chair.

Items under discussion included:

- **Road calming scheme** – all necessary paperwork was in place and approved by County and the Parish Council notified that start of the work would be imminent.
- **Coastal erosion and Churchyards** – clarification will be sought as to the treatment of buried remains in the three churchyards at risk, i.e. Happisburgh, Mundesley and Trimingham. Coastwise was contacted for updates. A report on coastal erosion in North Norfolk and the Churchyards can be found at the NNDC website. Discussions are ongoing with the Norfolk Diocese.

- **Precept** – for 2026/27 was discussed and an increase of 5% agreed.

Nature Notes *from Mac Marshall*

What soggy times we are in. I haven't travelled far but even locally there are things to see. Between showers I went down the old railway track towards the canal to check on the badger setts and found one that was new to me. I took a photo of a fresh badger footprint with its 3 enormous claws.

One fine day in February at Felbrigg I noticed a bird that didn't quite conform so I had to investigate. It seemed like a buzzard but wasn't so wary. Another man with binoculars agreed. I got closer and took some photos but they weren't clear. At home I checked my books and realised it was a rough-legged buzzard which are Winter visitors along with geese etc, and I was told that none had been recorded locally for about 4 years. On that same visit I watched a pair of goldcrests frantically feeding in some brambles totally ignoring the passing walkers in their search for food.

I had a lucky day at Hickling. There were the usual ducks and swans but I saw a bittern rise out of the reeds and fly to another bed 100 yards away. I reported it at the Visitors Centre who said it was the only report that day. Even my friend Julian, who had been there since 8 am, hadn't seen one.

One Sunday, sitting in my conservatory a red kite floated lazily past and then within a few minutes a buzzard did exactly the same. Later that day on my way to Cley there were hundreds of Brent geese in the wetlands at Salthouse. There were about 500 lapwings in a large flock which kept being disturbed by the marsh harrier flying over, likewise a flock of 200 or so widgeon.

The peregrine falcons are still on Cromer Church tower and will hopefully breed again this year.
